SATURDAY 28 JUNE:

1400-1600: KB1ZZX-Chuck
1500-1700: W1QZ-Jack
1600-1800: KC1AQP: Paul
1800-2000: KC1ARO: Rich and KC1AAA: Dave
2000-2200: KC1AQQ: Steve

SUNDAY 29 JUNE:

0800-1000: K1JSM: John
1000-1200: KC1AQP-Paul and KB1ZZX-Chuck
1200-1400: KC1ARO-Rich and W1QZ-Jack

Our Exchange: Whisky One Lima Yankee, Two Alpha Rhode Island

Record time once at the top of each page. Use LOCAL time.

One contact per line. No crossouts. No blank lines.

Use scratch paper for notes - NOT THE LOG.

Draw a line across the page when changing mode

No need to record Band in the 6m log. We know all contacts are 6m.

We DO need to know the mode (SSB or CW) This is important!

Exchange received from station worked.

Callsign of station worked.

The exchange you send is always "2A RI" No need to log it.

BAND (AND MODE) IS
VERY IMPORTANT!

FD logs are very easy, relative to other contest logs. No need to log the time of each contact. The time entry at the top of each page is for after-action analysis to calculate run rates and other stats.

You do not need to record Band in the 6m log (since it's always 6m) but you DO need to keep track of mode. Record the mode at the top of each page AND WHENEVER CHANGING MODES. This is important! Your operation might be %100 SSB, but it's always possible that someone will want to work CW (which I encourage since CW contacts count double.) One of the CW ops from the main CW station might drop in for a few QSO's to help bump up the score.
