The August 13, 2019 NCRC meeting was called to order by Dick KC1IPJ at 7:05 PM. There were 27 members and one guest present.

He had just returned from the National Jamboree where he had an opportunity to launch several low altitude balloons (payload weight including the transmitter was 1.5 ounces), and a large Fox Hunt. Mike hopes to work with ASA's new science teacher for a balloon launch. Their HF plans are moving forward as they are in the zoning process for their tower.

The treasurer was not available at the meeting.

Scott WX1X gave an update on ARES. The first EC001 class was given and next Saturday will be session 2. Still looking for people for the Tour de Cure (Sept 29th).

John K1JSM and Jim KA1ZOU announced the Pomham Rocks & Ruth Island activation planned for August 18th. Space is limited to one more operator, but transportation is provided from the dock.

Bob gave the preliminary results for the Membership Interest Survey. 43 people had responded (out of 130), which is actually pretty good. In broad terms the club is clearly interested in outdoor HF activities (Field Days, JOTA, Activations, etc.), but showed little interest in contesting as a club. Build-Night interest was quite high, but project interest varies widely (so we might have several smaller Build-Nights).
