JOTA – Background



- What is it?
 - Annual Scouting event that uses amateur radio to link Scouts around the world
 - NCRC's 3rd straight year
 - QST reported explosive growth in JOTA participation over 2011-2013 (5-10x growth in # of scouts)
 - 2012 JOTA had nearly 700,000 Scout participants from more than 13,500 amateur radio stations
 - BSA reported 2014 JOTA had more than 1 million Scout participants from more than 11,500 stations, nearly 20,000 amateur radio operators, and reached 157 countries
- Why do it?
 - Scouts are "seed corn" for the future of amateur radio
 - Scouting's proven focus on community service
 - Scouting has a renewed interest in STEM (Science-Technology-Engineering-Math)





- The 58th JAMBOREE ON THE AIR starts Friday evening (October 16th) local time and runs through Sunday evening (October 18th)
