


Update existing webpage

- Thank you, John Mills, K1JSM and team, Website Update Committee
- **Problem**: After months of research, the Website Committee Chair, John Mills presented an option to use a service to manage our membership. The EC voted against using the service that cost estimate was \$5 year/per member. The main reason identified was cost creep. The plan had a starting grant of almost \$1000 from a donor.
- Action: Establish a small Tiger Team with website experience to modify our site to accomplish our list of goals in sprints (small steps).

Goals for our Website
